

Youth Wellness Hubs Ontario is opening a multi-service hub for youth aged 12-25 in Rockland and Cornwall. These sites will provide rapid access to services that address the needs of youth related to mental health, substance use, primary care, employment/training, housing and other community and social services. This initiative, led jointly by the Cornwall Community Hospital, Valoris for Children and Adults of Prescott-Russell, and Hawkesbury & District General Hospital includes over 20 partner organizations. As a key partner, Le Centre de santé communautaire de l'Estrie is the hiring organization for this position.

## WHAT TO EXPECT?

The Community Health Worker for the Eastern Champlain Youth Wellness Hub identifies and analyzes the needs of the clients of the Hub (12 to 25 years old), coordinates and implements community health programs and services to meet the needs of diverse youth while facilitating their empowerment. The Youth Wellness Hub is open youth-friendly hours and therefore, the Community Health Worker will work days, some evenings and Saturdays at both the Cornwall and Rockland locations.

## QUALIFICATIONS

- Undergraduate degree obtained from a recognized university in social work, community health or health science or the combination of a post-secondary diploma and extensive experience
- Three to five years of experience in community health or mental health and addiction, preferably with youth
- Experience in community development and in program implementation, supervision and evaluation
- Experience working with the public, interdisciplinary team, committees and community partners
- Knowledge of standard software (Word, Excel, Outlook, etc.) and experience with leading virtual meetings and presentations by video (Zoom, Microsoft Teams, etc.)
- Knowledge and ability to take into account the determinants of health in the planning and implementation of programs, groups and community initiatives
- Ability to establish and maintain links with youth, their families, the community organizations and community groups
- Ability to prepare, facilitate, present and regularly evaluate community health programs offered at the Hub
- Ability to act as a resource for youth and Hub colleagues and provide them with the support they need to achieve their goals
- Excellent ability to communicate in French and English orally and in writing
- Team player with strong analytical capabilities and a focus on customer service
